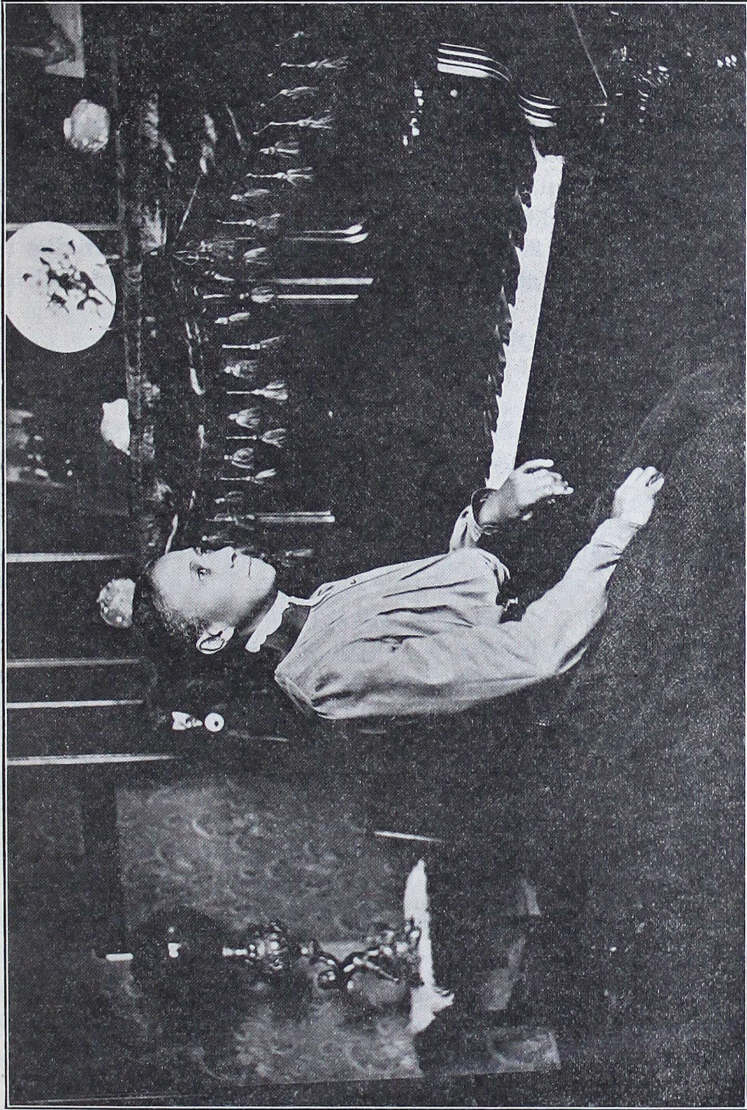

I'd be Buried in My Grave."

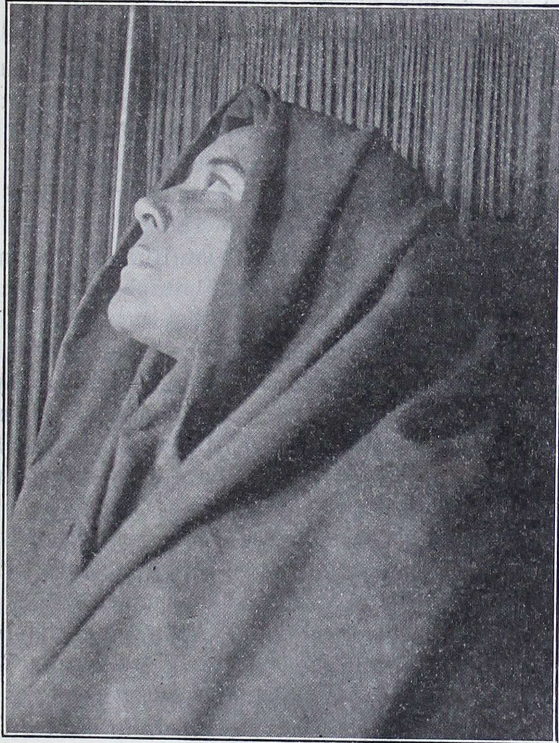


MRS. ELLA SHEPPARD MOORE,
